

Eighty-eighth Arizona Town Hall

“Arizona’s Rapid Growth and Development: Natural Resources and Infrastructure”

Held in Prescott on April 9 through 12, 2006, the 88th Arizona Town Hall focused on the growth and development that is reshaping the state as it approaches the celebration of its first 100 years of statehood.

From the draft report created at the conclusion of the Town Hall “Questions with profound and far-reaching implication arise. How will the very features of Arizona’s natural and built environment that have contributed most strongly to the state’s expansion be impacted by growth they fostered? What stewardship of Arizona’s natural resources is needed to ensure sustainability and how should it be implemented? What coordination is needed among federal, state, local, and tribal governments? How can current and future transportation and housing needs best be planned for and met? How might Arizona’s public and private sectors provide appropriate leadership, laws, policies and financial resources to support and encourage desirable growth?”

A PowerPoint presentation will be presented at the May 11, 2006, council meeting that highlights the significant recommendations put forth by 5 panels that addressed a common set of questions.
