REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
AUGUST 8, 2006

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| A | The duly posted Airport Advisory Committee meeting was called to order in the Council Chambers at approximately 4:00 p.m. by Dick Walker, Chair, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. | Meeting Time & Place |
| B | ROLL CALL: Chair Dick Walker, Vice Chair Ward Johnson, Members, Gary Spragins, Donovan Thornhill, and Dick Mumma.

| F | James Garner requested the Committee fill Hilda Crawford's vacancy as soon as possible. | James Garner
Committee Opening |
| G | Robert Oswald, Payson Aviation, stated there were 2 independent issues concerning a second FBO for the Committee to consider: 1. Should a second FBO be allowed? He stated that the quick answer from the Airport Department was we had to because of FAA Grant Assurance #22. However, he believed Grant Assurance #23 was being ignored since it specifically allowed for single FBOs for small airports. He believed the Town had the ability to deny the Bravo Partner's request for a second FBO. 2. Should a second FBO be allowed access to Town owned fuel storage tanks? He believed the answer was "no" according to the current FBO lease, the FAA grant assurances and the increased liability risk.

He further discussed these and other objections. Mr. Oswald denied his fuel prices were among the highest in the state as stated in the Bravo Partner's proposals. He disagreed with the statement that an US DOT license to sell fuel was needed and the business was not expanding. | Robert Oswald

| H | Dan Anderson spoke for Bravo Partners. He said they were proposing this business venture because they believed it would be profitable, an additional fuel vendor at the airport would benefit the aviation community, airport users and the town, and that they had a right to do so. | I | Ted Anderson, Airport Manager, noted that both gentlemen spoke | Ted Anderson |

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during an open call to the public and the Committee could not discuss or take action on matters raised during public comments. They could, however, ask staff to review a matter or put it on a future agenda. He read the agenda item before the Committee. He also read a memorandum the Legal Department sent to Manager Anderson and Mr. Mumma stating that a specific operator or specific business could not be discussed by the Committee.

| B | Chair Walker was concerned with a second fueling operation the Town would have to supply separate tanks since the existing tanks are leased to Payson Aviation. He asked Dan Anderson to answer questions concerning his plans for an office and the need for separate tanks. | C | Manager Anderson clarified that comments made by the Chair concerning the use of fuel tanks were his personal thoughts and not the necessarily the opinion of the Town staff or legal department. | D | Member Mumma declared this was economic development discussion and not a policy decision or a decision the Airport Manager can make on his own. He stated it had been held back from the Committee. It was before the Committee because he had completed a records request to see the Bravo Partners proposal. He asked questions from Dan Anderson and requested a business plan. Dan Anderson answered questions concerning their plans and discussed the inability and refusal of the current FBO to service the market. Member Mumma discussed Payson Aviation's service and Bravo Partners proposal. He was concerned about breaking the lease for the fuel tanks. | Member Mumma

| E | Member Spragins stated his opinion that two FBO's at the airport were not viable. He agreed with Bob Oswald concerning FAA grant assurances. He believed this to be a policy decision that should be before the Committee. Member Spragins proposed a motion to deny the request of Bravo Partners and if the Town Council decided to ignore their recommendation and grant another FBO at the airport that that FBO be set up in exactly the same way as the current FBO with its own tanks, its own area and its own building, so that the two leases | Member Spragins

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| A | Chair Walker asked Manager Anderson what was legal for them to discuss. Manager Anderson answered that in his opinion the existing discussion had been inappropriate and left it to the Chair. He said the Committee was in a direction contrary to legal opinion. | F | Member Spragins read an email to Manager Anderson from the Deputy Town Attorney, Tim Wright. He restated his motion to recommend to the Council to deny a second FBO at the airport, but should the Council approve a second FBO its lease should be set up in exactly the same way as the current FBO with its own tanks, its own area and its own building, so that the two leases would be identical.
