

**TOWN OF PAYSON
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
January 10, 2008**

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Edwards called the meeting at order at approximately 5:30 p.m. in the Town Hall Council Chambers.

INVOCATION

Lynn Richie, Chaplain, RTA Hospice, lead the meeting in an invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Interim Town Manager Debra Galbraith announced that the Parks & Recreation activity guides were available, that the Building Department will host a construction energy conservation seminar to be held in the Council Chambers, that the Police Department is implementing a silent witness program and that the Library's "Taste of the Rim Country" event is coming up in February.

1. Comments, Commendations, and Presentations by Mayor, Council Members, and/or Town Staff.

Mayor Edwards moved item K.3 to the beginning of the agenda and pull I.8 from the agenda.

- K.3 Appointment of Susan McIntyre to the Design Review Board, replacing Levi Amon, term to expire 12/31/09. Removed from the Consent Agenda. Clmn. Vogel voiced his concern that there were qualified applicants who lived within the Town limits, where Ms. McIntyre did not. The Design Review Board allows for two members to live outside the Town limits if they own businesses within Town boundaries.

Clmn. Vogel announced that the Literacy Program had suffered a loss of books from flooding and needed book donations.

Mayor Edwards commended Daniel Connelly for winning national bike races, the

Planet Payson website's video on Blue Ridge and the In-and-Out Cleaning service for their cleanup work around the 'Welcome to Payson' sign.

2. Status Report regarding PATS given by Mary McMullen, Trails and Outdoor Recreation Coordinator.

Mary McMullen introduced Dave Rutter, Parks & Recreation Advisory Board. He reported on PATS activities. The Gila County trail head and Peach Loop trail have both been prepared. Volunteers have donated their time and equipment to help.

3. Status Report regarding the YMCA given by Rick Manchester, Parks and Recreation Director.

Mr. Manchester said he continues to meet with representatives from the YMCA to resolve questions and issues. Current discussions include a possible 60/40 split in maintenance/operational costs. There would be a board appointed to manage the facility. YMCA representatives are still working with the Taylor Pool site in mind. George Scobis, Executive Vice-President of the YMCA, Valley of the Sun was present. Clmn.Vogel asked that at least half of the management board be from Payson.

4. Presentation of the Office of Tourism and Economic Vitality (OTEV) Website by Cameron Davis, Tourism/Economic Vitality Director.

Cameron Davis, OTEV Manager, presented the tourism website.

Council Decision Request filed by LaRon Garrett, Town Engineer, to approve the contract with Roundabouts & Traffic Engineering for the design of a modern Roundabout at the intersection of Highway 260 and Mud Springs Road for a fee of \$42,025.00 and authorize the Mayor to sign the necessary contract documents. OR To approve the contract with Roundabouts & Traffic Engineering for the design of a modern Roundabout at the intersection of Highway 260 and Mud Springs Road for a fee of \$42,025.00; to authorize the Mayor to sign the necessary contract documents; to direct staff to investigate traffic calming measures that could be implemented along Mud Springs Road-Phoenix Street route between Highway 260 and Highway 87; and for staff to report back to the Town Council concerning proposed traffic calming measures to discourage through traffic along Phoenix Street and Mud Springs Road corridor prior to beginning construction on Mud Springs Road Phase 2.

Suzanne Covert, Joanie King (representing Rim View Heights residents), Marie Sumegi, Caroline Baltz, Maggie McCarey, Shirley Dye, Bill Gilham, Gary Bedsworth, Tom Loeffler (Chair of STAC), Patty Montgomery, Tom Milton, Lew Levinson, Ron Waugh, Mike McGuire, Lee Norman, Bob Dye, Roger Freeman, Randy Loman, Nancy O’Roark, Kenny Evans, Chuck Gorn, Sue Yale, Leon Keddington and Al Poskanzer opposed the project because of safety concerns and the opportunity it posed for Beeline Highway traffic to use it as a ‘bypass’. It was suggest that the project go to the STAC for review. Ginger Henry supported the extension for fire protection and emergency response and safety. Bob Klaus, bus driver for Frontier Elementary School, liked the roundabout and extension of Mud Springs Road for easier access.

Clmn. Blair asked for a future Council Work study on the project.

more public input and for the STAC to bring its findings back to Council at the earliest possible time.
