

RESOLUTION NO. 2464

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PAYSON, ARIZONA, AMENDING THE LICENSE FEES FOR DOGS.

WHEREAS, section 90.35 of the Code of the Town of Payson requires that all persons owning, keeping, or harboring any dog over the age of four months procure a to be license for such dog; and

WHEREAS, section 90.36(B) of the Code of the Town of Payson requires a license fee to be paid in the amount determined by the Town Council by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council desires to amend the license fees for dogs,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PAYSON, ARIZONA, DO HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town Council hereby determines that the following shall be the license fees for dogs:

Length of License	Altered dog	Unaltered dog
One-year	\$7.00	\$20.00
Two-year	\$14.00	\$40.00
Three-year	\$21.00	\$60.00

Re: Administrative Animal Control Fee Adjustments

As provided by resolution number 2464 of the Town of Payson, the police department had requested a change in dog licensing fees, in the future. Along with those fees, the Payson Police Department plans to make some administrative fee changes to begin on the same date as the licensing changes.

Contained in these administrative fee changes would be a \$20 impound fee: to include the capture and first day boarding for any animals impounded. Any additional day of impound, past the first 24 hours, will be charged at \$10 per day. Along with this, and beginning on the implementation date of the current resolution, the Payson Police Department will begin requiring a \$20 deposit on animals that are impounded and have no proof of rabies vaccination. Therefore, until a rabies shot vaccination certification can be produced the deposit will be held. This will ensure that the animal is properly vaccinated for rabies in our community. As indicated, this is just a deposit and upon a verified rabies certificate this fee will be returned.
